<u>Faith That Cannot Be Shaken</u>

V26 When God spoke from Mount Sinai His voice shook the earth, but now He makes another promise: "Once again I will shake not only the earth but the heavens also." **V27** This means that all of creation will be shaken and removed, so that only unshakable things will remain, **V28** Since we are receiving a Kingdom that is unshakable, let us be thankful and please God by worshiping Him with holy fear and awe. **V29** For our God is a devouring (or) consuming fire" Hebrews **12:26-29** (NLT)

It is my mission to build the faith of the people here at Cedarbrook, but in order to build the people's faith there are some questions we all must ask ourselves, questions like:

1. What is faith? **2.** How does faith work? **3.** What does faith look like? **4.** How is faith used? **5.** Do we need faith? And **6.** Can we live without faith and still serve God?

- Jude Tonzola asked for a motion to accept July's minutes as read. Alice Uhl moved to accept and it was seconded by Betty Lou Hall.
- > Patricia Stuber read the list of the New, Deceased and Discharged residents since our last meeting.
- Marvin Kerchner, Vice President, read The Resident's Right for August.

Rights of Incapacitated Residents - If you are found to be incapacitated under

the law of the state, a guardian will be appointed under state law to act on your behalf. Old Business:

Referrals were read and reviewed by Resident Council Liaison, Heidi Heffelfinger.
New Business:

Resident Concerns/Comments:

- > Resident voiced a concern about staff not introducing themselves to the resident for each shift. Residents would like to know who will be providing care to them throughout the day.
 - A referral will be sent to proper department.
- Resident had a question about receiving insulin during meal times. Resident would like her insulin after her meals. She has a concern about being marked as a refusal for meds.
 - A referral will be sent to proper department.
- Resident has a concern about ordering extra food on meal tray for a snack later. Resident feels staff does not allow him to do so in fear of over eating. Resident wants extra food as a snack for when ordering is not available. A referral will be sent to proper department.
- Resident had a concern with staff assisting roommate to get ready for bed while she is still eating her meal. Resident does not want to be disturbed during her meal times.

A referral will be sent to the proper department.

Resident voiced a concern about how staff does not talk through the bathroom privacy curtain. They come in and open the curtain giving the resident little privacy. Resident can hear through the curtain and staff should respect the privacy curtain.

A referral will be sent to the proper department.

For our Disney week celebration we would like to feature a favorite dessert that is commonly a sweet hit right out of the Magic Kingdom Park! The ooey gooey toffee cake is the signature dessert served at The Liberty Tree Tavern in Disney's Magic Kingdom. This Disney dessert lives up to its name, it ooey and gooey but also delicious!

Ingredients

Cake Bottom 1 box yellow cake mix 1 egg 1/2 cup (1 stick) butter

Cake Filling 8 ounces cream cheese 3 eggs 1 teaspoon vanilla extract 1/4 cup butter 1 cup semi-sweet chocolate chips 1 cup Heath Bar pieces 1 pound powdered sugar

Instructions

Cake Bottom

- 1. Mix ingredients.
- 2. Put an greased 13" by 9" baking pan.

Cake Filling

- 1. Put cream cheese in the mixer.
- 2. Slowly add eggs and vanilla.
- 3. Add butter and mix well.

4. Add powdered sugar; then add the chocolate chips and the Heath Bar pieces. Just mix but DO NOT OVER MIX.

- 5. Pour on top of the Ooey Gooey Toffee Cake Bottom in the pan.
- 6. Bake at 325°F for 35 min. and check for doneness.



The chemistry BEHIND THE COLORS OF

UTUMN LEAVES

 Chlorophyll gives leaves their green color.

- Plants produce chlorophyll in sunlight and warm weather.
- Chlorophyll production decreases during autumn.



- Orange leaves contain beta-carotene.
- Beta-carotene contributes to orange colors in vegetables.
 - Orange carotenoids decrease at a far slower rate than chlorophyll.



- Carotenoids are responsible for yellow leaves.
- Carotenoids are yellow pigments also found in vegetables.
- Yellow colors become dominant when chlorophyll decreases.



- The color red is triggered by anthocyanin synthesis.
- Anthocyanin helps protect leaves from excess light.
- Anthocyanin prolongs the time that leaves fall from trees.
